Unemployment Insurance - WA

2.1 million initial claims filed during the pandemic

- 1.3 million regular unemployment insurance
- 431,002 Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA)
- 371,350 Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC)

1.2 million distinct individuals have filed for unemployment benefits

ESD has paid over \$6.7 billion in benefits

866,416 individuals who have filed an initial claim have been paid

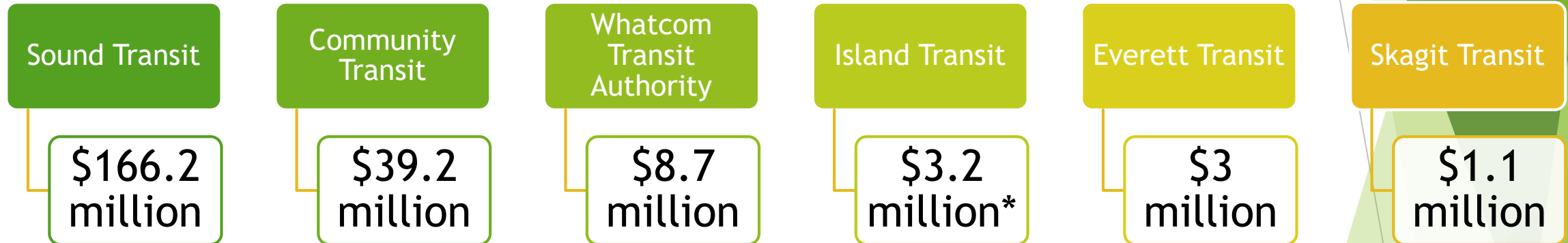

Expanding Capacity for Coronavirus Testing

- CHC Snohomish County: \$1.1 million
- SeaMar: \$3.37 million
- UnityCare NW: \$420,019

CARES Act Supplemental Funding

- CHC Snohomish County: \$1.77 million
- SeaMar: \$4.87 million
- UnityCare NW: \$875,660

Healthcare Providers - 2nd District

- ▶ Provider relief fund:
 - ▶ General fund (\$50 billion)
 - ▶ High impact fund (\$12 billion)
 - ▶ Rural fund (\$10 billion)
- ▶ 350 Second District providers received distributions, totaling \$56 million

Telehealth Waivers

- ▶ Telehealth allowed prior to COVID-19 pandemic, but restricted.
- ▶ CARES Act increased CMS and HHS statutory authority.
- ▶ Some specific areas improved:
 - ▶ Rural Health Clinics
 - ▶ Veteran Affairs services
 - ▶ Hospice
 - ▶ Substance abuse treatment
 - ▶ Federally Qualified Health Centers.
- ▶ Waivers are in place until “end of the Public Health Emergency”

Housing & Community Development

\$23 million to Washington state for:

- ▶ Assistance for Low-Income Individuals, Elderly Persons, and Needy Children
- ▶ Families and Entities Impacted by Economic and Housing Market Disruptions
- ▶ Efforts to Reduce Risk of Transmission and Number of Coronavirus Cases

Food Security

Farms to Family Food Box Program

\$3 billion to purchase fresh produce,
dairy, and meat products

Distributors package pre-approved,
family-sized food boxes

In the district: Puget Sound Food
Hub distributing 200 boxes per week

Food Security

Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP)

- ▶ Certain farmers and ranchers eligible for compensation for losses due to price declines
- ▶ Two funding sources:
 - ▶ \$9.5 billion from CARES Act
 - ▶ \$6.5 billion through Commodity Corporation Charter Act
- ▶ FSA has processed \$4.9 billion in payments to almost 320,000 producers
- ▶ In Washington, \$47 million to 1,494 producers

Education - WA



Education Stabilization Fund

- ▶ Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund (GEER) - \$56.8 million
- ▶ Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER) - \$216 million
- ▶ Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) - \$213.1 million
