YOU WILL NEED TO COMPLETE TRAINING AND SCREENING

- 75-hour, Washington State-required training to work with vulnerable adults
- Criminal background check
- Fingerprints taken, likely in Mt. Vernon.

HCA CERTIFICATION IS PORTABLE

You won't have to repeat the training if you change employers.

You might receive higher pay based on prior experience.
